Thanks once again for your ongoing support, we look forward to welcoming you to our monthly markets and seeing you at our events this year.


Honley Superhero

Magdale Land

Spring is approaching and in March we can expect frogs to be laying their frogspawn in our wetland pond. Frogs. Toads and Newts are protected species and, however tempting it might be, frog or toad spawn should not be removed from the pond. The purpose of the pond is to improve the biodiversity of the area and provide a focus of interest for people who visit Magdale, particularly children.




Since the last newsletter we have cleared Spider Alley and Lovers Walk of leaves, cleaned out bird boxes ready for the Spring and cleared more holly from the 'Oak' woodland area.

We have also continued our work in clearing undergrowth in Southgate Woods in preparation for planting approximately 100 'whips' which will grow into small trees.

River Holme Connections have undertaken some hedging of small trees, extending the hedge established a few years ago and creating a new hedge at the bottom of the steps leading to the 'island' field. There is a small section of hedging to be completed and then we will erect an arch, made by Mick Kirkby-Geddes and donated to us, near the steps.

In conjunction with Eden Forest CIC work will commence shortly

on improving the path along Magdale Dam and establishing wetland and


