#### Getting Muddy At Magdale-

In August, due to the continuing dry wether we were able to cut, turn and bail the hay from the fields thanks to Dave Benson who was keen to use his tractor and equipment to complete the necessary tasks. Next year we hope to see how we can extend the area of wildflowers.

The apple trees in Honley Community Orchard received a good watering during the dry spell and with luck all of these trees have survived. We will look to extend the orchard next Spring.

We have continued to thin the holly in the oak woodland and taken out unwanted saplings along the Magdale Dam bank. In November will be planting an Oak in memory of Ian Blagborough, two golden willow trees and some alder trees along Mag Brook.

In October we started a new project in Southgate Woods, clearing some of this area to create a managed woodland of native trees that will support wildlife. There is a five year plan to undertake this work.

On October 15 Magdale hosted the last event of Holmfirth Arts Festival 2023. Light Up Magdale was a magical lantern trail created by Satellite Arts, with some of the lanterns made by local school children. It was a wonderful event using the natural surroundings of Magdale.

#### - It's No Wind Up! -

Andrew Hampshire and Honley St Mary's Church Clock written by Peter Hampshire

Andrew Hampshire, my dad, wound the clock up for half a century. He started in December 1971 and made his final trip in May 2022.

Not many people know, but the clock requires winding every six days, during his 51 years of voluntary service he made the journey around two and a half thousand times, far more than any of those before him. He started when he was a sixteen year old boy living in the village and continued long after he retired from work, a task my dad took great pride in.

Over the years dad taught me how to maintain the clock and it's a task I have now honour of keeping in the family. The door to the clock tower is located at the west side of the church. Forty eight stone steps lead you to the first floor, three glass windows provide fantastic views down onto Honley centre.

The middle part of the weight shaft is found encased by wood panels. A ladder consisting of sixteen runs leads to the back of the clock face and the clock mechanism. The names of all who have wound the clock are engraved on the inside.

It takes just over sixty revolutions to bring the minute's weight and approximately thirty revolutions to raise the hour hand to the top. The pendulum hangs below the

cabinet with coins on the top to ensure it is swinging correctly. A thirteen run ladder takes you to the bells. Although the original bell is still there, a smaller bell that sits next to it is now used. A final ladder takes you to the roof of the tower, from here you can see Honley and neighbouring villages in all their beauty.

During his time dad climbed and descended over one hundred and fifteen thousand stone stairs and over thirty eight thousand runs on the ladder.

I ask the next time you look at the clock or listen to the chimes you remember this story, my dad, and the journey he made to keep a fundamental part of the village running.






