

What's happening at Honley Village Community Trust

Magdale Land

In August we had our last session this year clearing more Himalayan Balsam and hope that this will have an impact on the number of these invasive plants next year. Later in the month the grass was cut but it was too wet to bail, so we ended up turning it over and raking it to the side of the meadows. We are looking to provide a more permanent solution to bailing the grass and taking it offsite next year.

In October we focussed our attention on Southgate Woods where we cleared undergrowth, particularly in the area where we planted saplings in the Spring. Our plans over the next couple of months are to undertake some footpath improvements and our annual leaf clearance on Spider Alley and Lovers Walk.

We are pleased to be a participant in the **Nature's Holme** project that is funded by **DEFRA** and aims to increase biodiversity throughout the River Holme catchment. As part of the

planning stage a woodland management plan has been developed for Magdale's woodland areas, a botanical survey has established a baseline for our meadows, and soil samples have been taken. Plans will need to be approved by DEFRA but we hope that funding will enable us to enhance the biodiversity of Magdale meadows and woodland over the long term.

We have a core group of volunteers but could do with more people to keep on top of our work in managing Magdale and Southgate Woods. If you would like to join us on the second Sunday each month you'll be made very welcome. 
