Magdale Land

After such a wet winter we have been looking forward to Spring and seeing the whole area greening up and to see which wildflowers will prosper this year. It has been particularly gratifying to see the blossom on the fruit trees in the orchard. As these trees grow and we get more blossom we will arrange a celebration of Blossom Day (usually at the end of April) at the orchard.

What's happening at Honley Village Community Trust

Since the last report the Magdale Dam Improvement Project has commenced in conjunction with Eden Forest CIC. The coir matting impregnated with plants has been fixed along the Dam bank and the plants seem to have become established. Work has started on path improvements.



After tree works were undertaken in Southgate Woods we planted small woodland trees in the area that had been cleared. Hopefully these will begin to flourish during the summer.

After the completion of the hedge laying we erected the arch made by Mick Kirkby-Geddes as an entrance to the track that goes down to the lower 'island' field. This has received positive comments from the people walking on Magdale & has become an established feature.



We have planted some small oak tree, woodland bulbs and sown more wildflower seed in our efforts to improve the biodiversity of the area. More recently we have planted some plants attractive to bees around the bee bank and placed a temporary fence around the bee bank to protect the plants and the bee bank. It will also hopefully deter dogs from scrambling over the sand or being stung after showing too much interest in the bees! This summer should see whether the project is a success in attracting solitary bees.

We will be having a stand at the Honley Show to demonstrate the work on Magdale, so if you do attend on 29 June look out for us in the Countryside marquee.



((BOUNCE)) landed in Honley in October and has been rising high ever since. If you want fun and fitness, then local instructor Charlotte Brewer is the person you need to meet! What could be more fun than jumping on a trampoline?"

"A regular hour session offers various styles of fitness from cardio to bodyflow, circuits to strength. On Saturdays we do BLAST, which is a cardio jumping routine with a full body toning section. It's a low impact, high-energy workout for everybody! BLAST is the same as **((BOUNCE))** but only 45 minutes. Use our hand weights to intensify the jumping routines if you like. We also do a strength and conditioning class using a barbell to perform static moves off the trampoline with a low-level weight for high reps. Performed to pumping music, it will get your heart rate up and body tone tight."

The 2024 riding season has begun again, braving the challenging weather conditions of driving rain and gale-force winds that sweep across the hills at Honley. Riding lessons take place **Monday** & **Tuesday** evenings **6.30pm - 7.30pm** at Bradshaw Road Riding Stables up until the autumn. The Group provides riding lessons led by RDA volunteer coaches with volunteers to help get the horses ready beforehand and assist the riders in

leading ponies/horses and/or sidewalking support. Horse riding brings many benefits to disabled children and adults – physical improvement, confidence building, a sporting skill, making new friends and most of all having a fun time.

RDA volunteers don't need to have a horsey background as simple training is given: they are a vital part of the RDA sessions as the lessons couldn't take place without them. The Group committee and all the riders are very grateful to the wonderful team of helpers who turn up to ensure the sessions can take place. New helpers are very welcome and are actively being sought at this time.


